## GCSE Trip to Victoria and Albert Museum



This half term, our Year 10 Food preparation and nutrition students visited the Victoria and Albert museum to see an exhibition called "FOOD: Bigger than the Plate". The exhibition explored how food goes from farm to table, how we experience and enjoy it, and how we can help create a more sustainable food future. The exhibition featured over 70 projects,

split into four sections, Compost, Farming, Trading and Eating which tied in really well with our current topic of learning. Exhibits included an urban mushroom farm using coffee grounds from the museum cafe to grow mushrooms, which are then served on the menu; cheese made from human bacteria; and a new range of sausage designs to make eating protein more sustainable. Our students thoroughly enjoyed the day, and were able to sample food, as well as collect primary research for their coursework.

## GCSE Trip to Ashridge



On Tuesday 25th June, Year 10 Geography students visited Ashridge in Hertfordshire. The purpose of the trip was to experience a deciduous woodland at first hand and to collect data about the impact of people on the area. As geographers we are aware that trees and wildlife are vital for our continued existence and that woodlands need to be preserved for future generations. With over 60% of all species lost worldwide in the last 100 years we know that we need to do all we can to protect the habitats of the species that are left. At Ashridge many rare species can be found and parts of the woodland are protected. The trip was extremely muddy but we enjoyed being in such a special place and saw deer, squirrels, ancient trees and foxgloves on our walk through the wood.
